The quality and standards of the early years provision

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder and her assistant have a secure knowledge and understanding of safeguarding policies and practice to ensure children's safety is promoted. For example, they are aware of the action to take if an allegation is made against them and prevent the inappropriate use of mobile phones and cameras in their home.
- The childminder and her assistant hold current first-aid certificates and are aware of how to act in the event of a minor accident or emergency.
- The environment is well organised and provides a wide range of resources and activities, which are appropriate for children's ages and stages in development. The childminder and her assistant also understand the importance of supporting children to become independent and encouraging them to make decisions and choices.
- The childminder holds current public liability insurance to ensure she meets the requirements and can ensure children's well-being.
- The childminder and her assistant are aware of the importance of forming strong attachments with the children and their parents to help children settle and feel secure.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the importance of promoting healthy lifestyles, a healthy diet and the importance of children being able to access physical exercise on a daily basis.
- The childminder and her assistant demonstrate a good understanding of how to manage children's behaviour and have a clear policy in place to underpin their practice.
- The childminder and her assistant understand the importance of working in partnership with parents to support children's learning and development and ensure their care needs are met.

Information about this inspection

Inspections of registered early years provision are:

- scheduled at least once in every inspection cycle – the current cycle ends on 31 July 2016
- scheduled more frequently where Ofsted identifies a need to do so, for example where provision was previously judged inadequate
- brought forward in the inspection cycle where Ofsted has received information that suggests the provision may not be meeting the legal requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage or where assessment of the provision identifies a need for early inspection
- prioritised where we have received information that the provision is not meeting the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage and which suggests children may not be safe
- scheduled at the completion of an investigation into failure to comply with the requirements of the Early Years Foundation Stage.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The provision is also registered on the voluntary and compulsory parts of the Childcare Register. This report includes a judgment about compliance with the requirements of that register.

Inspection activities

- The inspector held discussions with the childminder and her assistant to ascertain their knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector looked at the childminder's policies and documents, including safeguarding and complaints.
- The inspector checked evidence of the childminder's and her assistant's suitability and qualifications.
- The inspector checked all areas of the home and the outdoor area that will be used for childminding purposes.

Information about the setting

The childminder was registered in 2004 and is on the Early Years Register and the compulsory part and voluntary parts of the Childcare Register. She lives with her partner and five children in a house in Staffordshire. Her partner is registered to work as an assistant. The whole of the ground floor and the rear garden are used for childminding. The family has three dogs, three cats, a rabbit, a hamster and fish as pets. The childminder collects children from local schools. There are currently 13 children on roll, two of whom are in the early years age group. There were no children present during the inspection. The childminder operates all year round from 7.15am to 6.15pm, Monday to Friday, except bank holidays and family holidays. She is a member of the Professional Association for Childcare and Early Years.

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Type of provision

For the purposes of this inspection the following definitions apply:

Full-time provision is that which operates for more than three hours. These are usually known as nurseries, nursery schools and pre-schools and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the higher fee for registration.

Sessional provision operates for more than two hours but does not exceed three hours in any one day. These are usually known as pre-schools, kindergartens or nursery schools

and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. They are registered on the Early Years Register and pay the lower fee for registration.

Childminders care for one or more children where individual children attend for a period of more than two hours in any one day. They operate from domestic premises, which are usually the childminder's own home. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage.

Out of school provision may be sessional or full-time provision and is delivered before or after school and/or in the summer holidays. They are registered on the Early Years Register and must deliver the Early Years Foundation Stage. Where children receive their Early Years Foundation Stage in school these providers do not have to deliver the learning and development requirements in full but should complement the experiences children receive in school.

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
